Probation

The Juvenile Department received 41 referrals during the month of June 2024.

Of the 41 referrals, 8 represent dependency, 6 status and 25 criminal.

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There are currently 209 youth in the Probation Unit either on probation or pending court with 34 of those being assessed high-risk.

There are currently 132 youth under the Community Programs Unit serving on informal probation and the Intervention Specialist is currently serving 88 youth. 82 of those youth are from the community with no involvement with law enforcement.

Work Crew

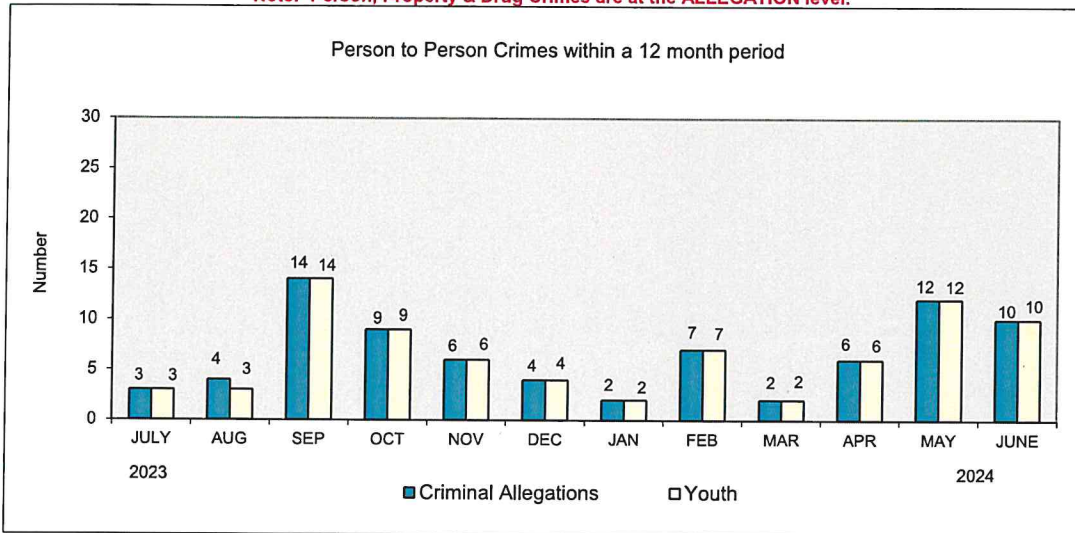

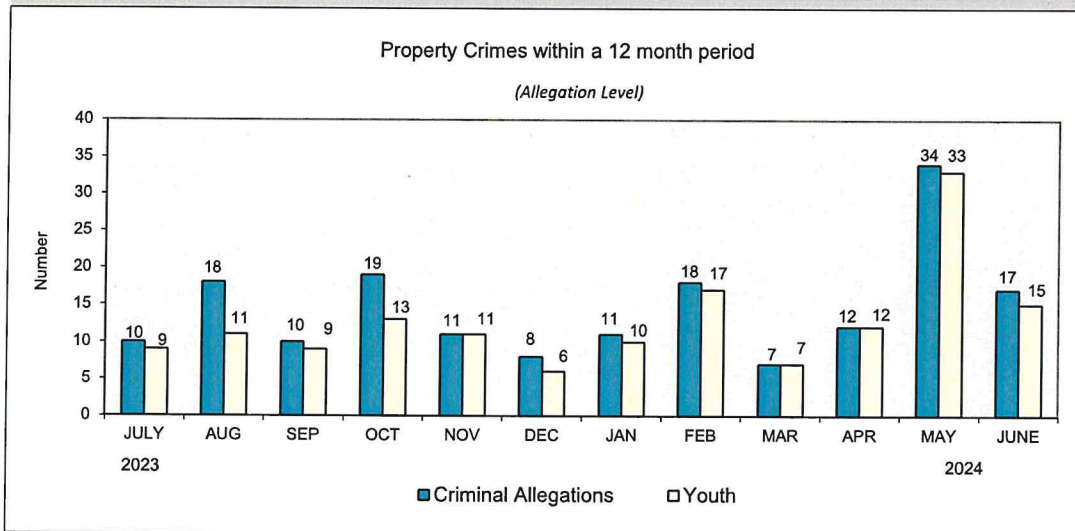

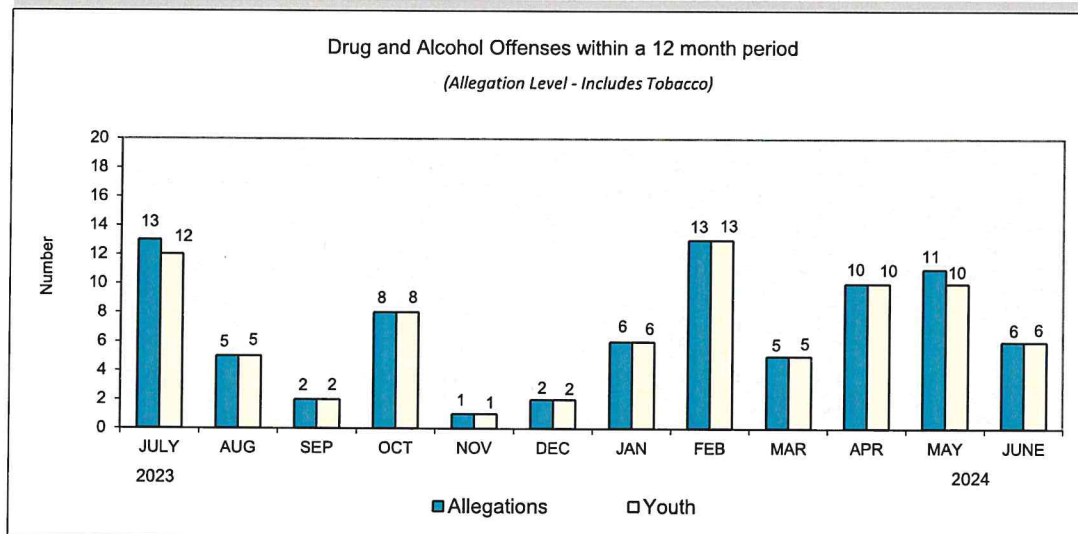

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Resolution and Order 2024-160

Intergovernmental Agreement between Clackamas County and Linn County Juvenile Detention Services Pay Per Use Agreement

RO 2024-160 is an agreement between Linn Clackamas Counties for the use of juvenile detention beds at the Linn Benton Juvenile Detention Center on an as needed basis at the rate of \$175 per day.

This is a new contract with Clackamas County who has recently terminated its contract with Multnomah County and the Donald E. Long Detention Center. Clackamas County has entered into a contract with Marion County as its primary provider of detention beds. This contract is to serve as an overflow for Clackamas County if they are in need of additional beds beyond what their contract with Marion County provides.

The following items are scheduled to be signed by the Board on July 30, 2024

Resolution & Order No. 2024-271 and Ordinance No. 2024-272 - PD24-0128: Applications by the City of Millersburg for a Comprehensive Plan Text Amendment and Reasons Exception to Statewide Planning Goals 3 and 14, affecting 1.44 acres of a 99.96-acre property identified as T10S, R3W, Sec. 20, Tax Lot 402. The property has a Plan Designation of Agricultural Resource and is zoned Exclusive Farm Use (EFU). The Applicant proposes a Goal Exception for Goals 3 and 14 to allow an urban driveway through EFU-zoned property in order to provide access to a set of landlocked parcels located within the City limits. The Application will culminate in two amendments to the Comprehensive Plan: 1) adding a Transportation Goal Exception to Appendix 2 (in two separate tables); and 2) adding proposed Tech Memo 7.1 into the County TSP.

The Board held a public hearing regarding this matter on July 16, 2024 and voted 3-0 to approve the applications.
