Detention

Benton: 2 youth were held for 13 total of days of care, 1 females and 1 males.

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Probation

The Juvenile Department received 41 referrals during the month of December 2024.

Of the 41 referrals, 6 represent dependency, 20 status and 14 criminal.

There are currently 180 youth in the Probation Unit either on probation or pending court with 33 of those being assessed high-risk.

There are currently 90 youth under the Community Programs Unit serving on informal probation and the Intervention Specialist is currently serving 49 youth. 44 of those youth are from the community with no involvement with law enforcement.

Work Crew

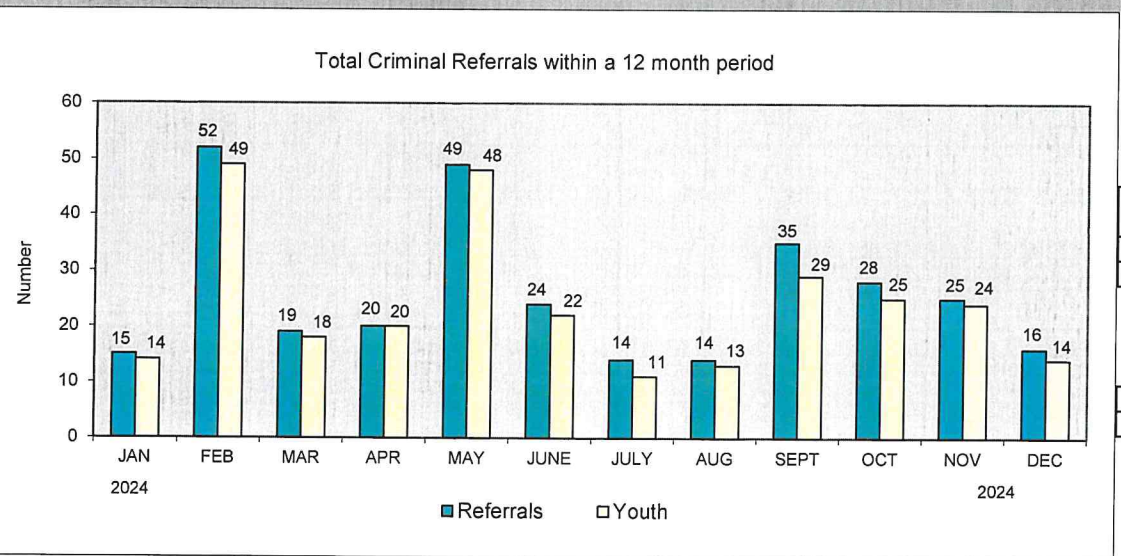

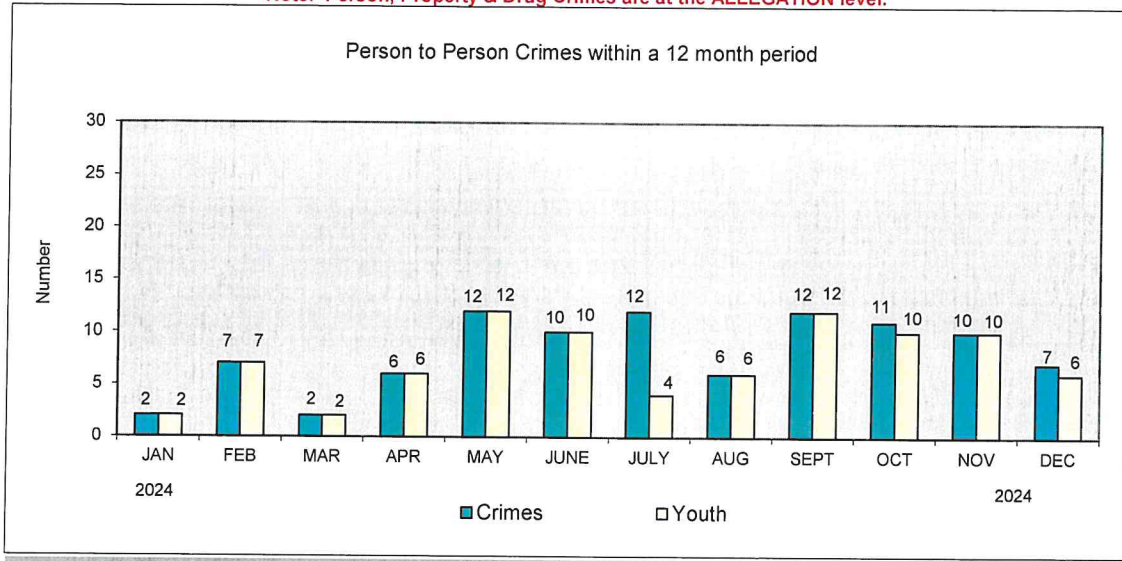

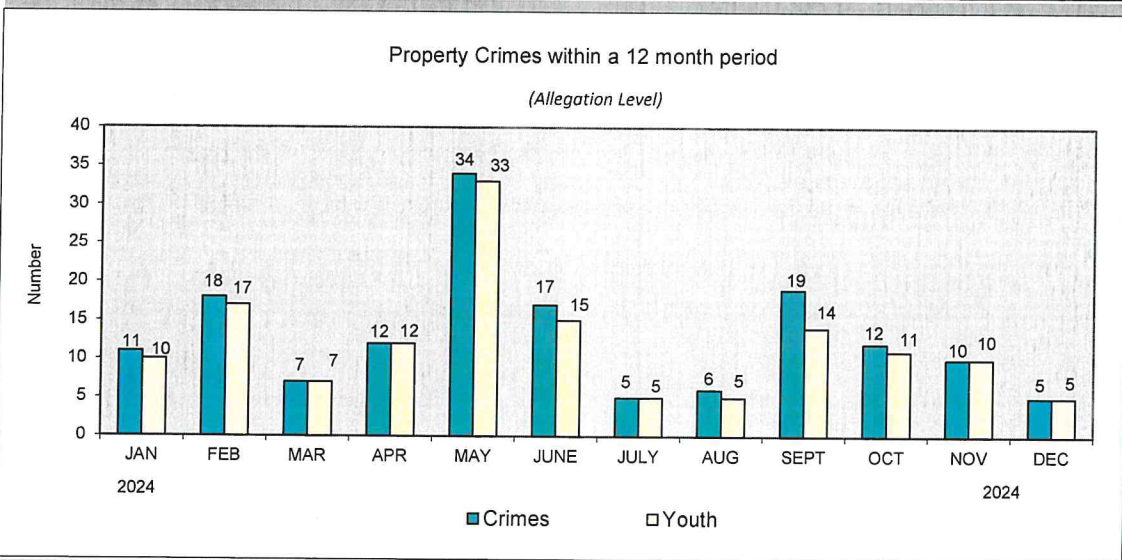
